Reminder of Email Code of Conduct for both Cresson and Jr/Sr High

As a result of some abuses of student email which have been discovered within the last month, here is a reminder of just some of the Code of Conduct items for email and network use. The complete Code of Conduct can be found on our website link:

Network Etiquette - The user is expected to abide by the generally accepted rules of network etiquette. These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Be polite. Do not get abusive in messages to others. Use appropriate language.

- Do not swear, use vulgarities, or any other inappropriate language. Illegal activities are strictly forbidden.
- Do not reveal personal home addresses or phone numbers to others.
- Do not reveal home addresses, email addresses, or phone numbers of other students or colleagues.
- **Note that electronic mail (email) is not guaranteed to be private.** Messages relating to or in support of illegal activities may be reported to the authorities.
- Sending or receiving messages that are obscene, profane, racist, sexist, inflammatory, threatening, or slanderous toward others.
- Sending messages or information with someone else's name on it or misrepresenting the source of information you enter or send.
- Sending or receiving messages or information that is inconsistent with the school's conduct code or assists others to violate that code.
- Harassing others or requesting or distributing addresses, home phone numbers, or other personal information which could be used to make inappropriate calls or contacts.
- Sending chain letters or engaging in "spamming" (sending an annoying or unnecessary message to large numbers of people.)

Educating Colorado Youth to be Responsible Drivers - A Class for Parents and Their New Drivers

With the support of the Teller County Sheriff's Department and Teller County Fire, DRIVE SMART COLORADO is bringing a Free CDOT sponsored GDL Class for Parents of new drivers to our area: Educating Colorado Youth to be Responsible Drivers to Teller County.

Three people teach the class: Program Coordinator for Drive Smart Colorado, a CDOT law enforcement (retired officer) liaison, and an insurance agent (he doesn't sell anything, he simply helps parents understand the hows and whens of adding a youth to their insurance.) The class is scheduled for Wednesday evening, February 6, starting at 5:30 pm (it takes about an hour) and will be held at the Teller County Fire Department in Divide (103 Cedar Mountain Road, Divide, CO 80814). Heart and Sole
